Letter from Governor Doug Burgum and First Lady Kathryn

In the face of uncertainty and upheaval, we have adapted to continue to support our families, friends, and neighbors as North Dakotan's have always done. Recovery Reinvented is more than a one-day event to celebrate the hope and promises that come from a life of recovery. It is an ongoing, statewide movement to end the shame and stigma surrounding this disease, creating supportive cultures that empower recovery.

Just like every organization, family, and individual had to do amidst the pandemic of 2020, we pivoted our approach to Recovery Reinvented and moved the 2020 event to a completely virtual, live event on October 28th. One of the goals of Recovery Reinvented each year is simply to "reach more people". The silver lining of having to change strategies this year was that the team shattered the goal of reaching more people. The fully livestreamed event impacted a record *5,000* lives! Attendees joined us from across the state, nation, and across the globe in places like France, Germany, Ireland and Thailand. In collaboration with our state behavioral health team, advocates in the trenches, state and local government leaders, and all of the amazing speakers, sponsors, and awardees of Recovery Reinvented -- the team demonstrated that you can reinvent recovery from wherever you are.

We are humbled and grateful for the organizations and leaders that continue to support the work of Recovery Reinvented as key partners, as advocates and as financial sponsors and donors. 

Record-Setting Attendance in First-Ever All-Virtual Event

Recovery Reinvented continues to grow year after year. The first event reached 650 attendees in 2017, while the 2020 virtual experience reached over 5,000 online viewers.

First Lady participates in White House roundtable discussion on Recovery-Friendly Workplaces

In September of 2020, First Lady Kathryn Burgum was a featured panelist at a White House roundtable discussion on recovery-friendly workplaces where she highlighted innovative North Dakotan businesses and leaders who are champions for recovery in the workplace.

Burgum joined First Lady Melania Trump, Office of National Drug Control Policy Director James Carroll, Surgeon General VADM Jerome Adams, senior administration officials and other leaders to discuss building recoveryfriendly workplaces.



Families Strong Offers Hope and Healing to Loved Ones

The Office of Recovery Reinvented launched five evidence-based family support groups across the state designed to support family members impacted by the disease of addiction. The groups were led by 5 fellow North Dakotans and focus on helping family members develop self-care, build social supports, and learn effective motivational strategies for interacting with a loved one who is struggling with a substance use disorder.

One participant in the 9-week program shared: "Families Strong has given me an outlet to express my feelings without judgment and also gave me tools to help myself through the process of dealing with a loved one in addiction. An added bonus is I believe I have made forever friends that genuinely care about me."

The program was made free and available to all who participated. Additional support groups will continue to be available for 9-week sessions and be led by trained group leaders.





Narcan Saves Lives

Since the first Recovery Reinvented in September of 2017, the distribution and training of Narcan, an opioid overdose-reserving antidote, has been a signature focus of the event. In partnership with the North Dakota Behavioral Health Division, 951 life-saving Naloxone kits have been distributed as part of the Recovery Reinvented events since 2017. The impact of Narcan training and accessibility at Recovery Reinvented events has been life-saving. One couple wrote after the first event:

"I want to thank you for a day of education, information, and hope.

I am especially grateful for the Narcan sample because yesterday morning my husband found our son overdosed in our bathroom. He administered the Narcan and by the time the EMT arrived he was conscious. He fully recovered from the overdose and is with us today.

My husband and I thank you for your platform on recovery and want you to know that it has been effective in one family, our family. A life has been spared. We have hope and we continue to press on."
